OUTLINE OF PSC DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCESS FOR NYISO COMPREHENSIVE RELIABILITY PLANNING

Parties should note that the process outlined below is intended for use as a last resort only. Department staff will be available to assist parties while a dispute is pending at the NYISO.

- 1. A party seeking New York Public Service Commission (Commission) review of a NYISO board determination concerning the final conclusions or recommendations of the reliability needs assessment, or a final determination of the NYISO in the CRP that a proposed solution will or will not meet a reliability need, should file and serve a petition pursuant to 16 NYCRR § 3.5. If there are disputed issues of fact, petitions should also include a request for a hearing.
- 2. If required, a notice pursuant to § 202 of the New York State Administrative Procedure Act will be submitted to the New York Department of State.
- 3. An Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) will be assigned to the case.
- 4. A procedural schedule will be established. The schedule may include filed testimony, hearings, post-hearing briefs and/or other process elements at the discretion of the ALJ after consultation with the parties.
- 5. After the conclusion of the procedural schedule, the ALJ will certify the record to the Commission.
- 6. The Commission will issue a decision at the earliest reasonably practicable time.
