NYISO Management Committee Meeting Minutes

May 23 2008 NYISO – Krey Corporate Center 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.pm.

1. Introductions, Meeting Objectives, and Chairman's Report

The Chair of the MC, Mr. Ray Kinney (NYSEG/RG&E) called the meeting to order at 10:05 AM and welcomed the members of the MC. The members of the MC then identified themselves.

Mr. Kinney initiated business by recognizing MC Members and NYISO staff, as well as NYISO Board Member and presiding President, Bob Hiney.

Mr. Kinney welcomed Mr. Silian, a guest from the FERC Division Energy Market Oversight.

2. Approval of Minutes

Mr. Kinney presented for approval MC minutes from the March 5, 2008 and April 23, 2008 meetings. Mr. Alcombright (NYISO) reported no comments were received to-date and asked if members had any comments. No comments or questions were raised. Both sets of minutes were approved.

Motion #1:

Motion to approve the Minutes of the March 5, 2008 and April 23, 2008 Management Committee meetings.

Motion passed unanimously.

3. President's Report

Mr. Hiney prefaced the President's Report with a brief announcement concerning a NYISO Board Member's position with the New York Port Authority and bridges it administers being part of the Demand Response Program. To proactively address any potential conflict of interest concerns, NYISO staff and Board Members consulted with counsel. At this time, no technical conflict appears to exist.

Further, the Board Member in question has agreed to recuse himself from votes addressing demand response-related issues.

NYISO is consulting FERC on the issue of technical conflict and the potential need to revise the tariff.

Multiple Market Participants expressed concerns and/or thoughts regarding this (technical conflict) announcement and the issues that it addresses.

NYISO Counsel further clarified that the Board Member would not only recuse himself from votes involving Demand Response, but would also remove himself from the Board discussions

surrounding such voting items. Counsel noted that safeguards, such as Board Minutes, existed – and were auditable by FERC – to ensure this was the case and to protect Board integrity.

Mr. Mager (Multiple Intervenors) suggested that the NYISO draft a memo clarifying the potential technical conflict(s) addressed in Mr. Hiney's announcement, as well as the rules for stakeholders to follow in judging such. Mr. Mager also noted that there should be a period allowed for comments from stakeholders.

NYISO agreed to research and respond to Mr. Mager's request at the next meeting of the Management Committee.

4. Enhancements to SRE Process

Ms. Peluso(NYISO) presented and discussed the posted motion and supporting materials (See posted meeting materials).

Motion #2:

The Management Committee hereby recommends that the Board of Directors approve revisions to the NYISO's Tariffs to: (A) resolve the apparent inconsistency between Sections 4.1.7 and 4.10 of the Market Services Tariff regarding payment of a Bid Production Cost Guarantee ("BPCG") to resources that Bid in Self-Committed mode in response to a Supplemental Resource Evaluation or when they are Out-of-Merit Generation for reliability; (B) clarify the circumstances under which resources committed in response to a Supplemental Resource Evaluation or committed or dispatched as Outof-Merit Generation for reliability will be eligible to receive a BPCG; (C) revise the rules for determining the Start-Up Bid to use when calculating a BPCG for resources that are committed via Supplemental Resource Evaluation or are Out-of-Merit Generation for reliability; (D) revise the Tariffs to permit economically committed hours to be included in the daily BPCG calculation, notwithstanding the fact that a resource Bid using a Self-Committed mode at a time when it was committed via a Supplemental Resource Evaluation or was Out-of-Merit Generation for reliability; and (E) revise the Tariffs to permit economically committed hours to be included in the daily BPCG calculation, notwithstanding the fact that a resource Bid using a Self-Committed mode during eligible start-up / shut-down and/or testing periods, The proposed revisions are in accordance with the proposed market rules discussed at the Market Issues Working Group on December 14, 2007, April 7, 2008 and April 30, 2008 and presented to the Business Issues Committee on May 16, 2008.

Motion passed unanimously with abstentions.

5. Enhancement to Transmission Study Deadlines

Mr. Murphy (Hunton & Williams) presented and discussed the posted motion and supporting materials (See posted meeting materials).

Motion #3

Motion to approve the Tariff Revisions Related to Order No. 890 Transmission Study Deadlines as presented at the May 23, 2008 Management Committee Meeting.

Motion passed unanimously with abstentions.

6. State of the Market Report (David Patton)

Mr. Patton (Potomac) presented and discussed the posted report and supporting materials (See posted meeting materials).

Multiple Market Participants expressed the belief that price convergence as it is related to interregional trading needs to be a high priority for the NYISO moving forward and solicit Mr. Patton's opinion. Mr. Patton discussed using Virtual Real-Time Dispatch (VRD) as one potential means to addressing this issue.

Mr. Mukerji (NYISO) reminded the committee that NYISO has already committed to looking more closely at VRD and suggested using previously drafted VRD white-papers to initiate new discussions.

Mr. Pike (NYISO) indicated the 2009 Potential Projects list presented at last month's MIWG and TPAS meetings has one or more projects that are designed to address these issues. Market Participants and NYISO staff will work together via the Budget and Prioritization Working Group beginning in July 2008 to weigh these issues in regard to formal project inclusion and prioritization.

7. Sector Meetings and Joint Board of Directors/ Management Committee Meeting

Mr. Alcombright reiterated the NYISO's gratitude for the active participation of its stakeholders in the recently concluded Sector Meetings. He also took the opportunity to review the logistics and format for the upcoming Joint Board of Directors/Management Committee Meeting, June 9, 2008 and June 10, 2008.
