New York Independent System Operator, Inc.'s Further Clarification  
of September 25, 2001 Filing in Docket No. ER01-3112-000

Dear Mr. Boergers:

Due to an administrative error, the NYISO inadvertently omitted a revised Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT") sheet from its "Further Clarification of September 25, 2001 Filing in Docket No. ER01-3112-000" filed on October 22, 2001. The NYISO hereby submits the missing OATT sheet which includes the same clarifying change that the NYISO has proposed be made to Second Revised Sheet No. 27 and Second Revised Sheet No. 97A of the Services Tariff. Specifically, the corrected OATT specifies that the NYISO will run its Balancing Market Evaluation ("BME") "no more than 90 minutes before the dispatch hour." The NYISO will specify a more precise running time, within the 90 minute period, in the ISO Procedures. The NYISO may, in conjunction with its stakeholders, modify the running time specified in the ISO Procedures as circumstances warrant and in a manner consistent with BME's technical operating requirements.<sup>1</sup>

The NYISO requests that no new Notice of Filing be issued in this proceeding because the proposed correction is so minor and because it is so important that the more substantive aspects of the September 25 Filing become effective by October 30, 2001. However, an amended Notice of Filing is attached in the event that the Commission finds a comment period necessary. If the Commission decides to issue an amended Notice, the NYISO requests that the comment period be no more than 5 days.

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<sup>1</sup> For example, it is not contemplated that the NYISO would run BME less than thirty minutes before a given dispatch hour.

Take notice that on October 26, 2001, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") filed a correction to revisions to its Open-Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT") to make permanent two temporary market rules pertaining to External Transactions that were initially implemented as "Extraordinary Corrective Actions," and to introduce several new enhancements to its external transaction scheduling processes. The NYISO has requested a waiver of the usual sixty day notice period so that this filing can become effective on October 30, 2001.

The NYISO has served a copy of the filing on all parties that have executed Service Agreements under the NYISO's Open-Access Transmission Tariff or Services Tariff, to the New York State Public Service Commission and to the electric utility regulatory agencies in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Any person desiring to be heard or to protest this filing should file a motion to intervene or protest with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, NE, Washington, DC 20426, in accordance with Rules 211 and 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 C.F.R. §§ 385.211 and 385-214). All such motions or protests should be filed on or before \_\_\_\_\_. Protests will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, but will not serve to make protestants parties to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a motion to intervene. Copies of this application are on file with the Commission and are available for public inspection.
