Dear Ms. Lampi:

On July 31, 2009, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) submitted an informational filing as directed by Ordering Paragraph (B) of the Commission's order issued July 14, 2006 in Docket No. ER06-1014-000 (July 14 Order).¹ Specifically, NYISO's informational filing indicates the causes of pricing errors and the associated corrections used during the period of January 1, 2009, through June 30, 2009, the duration and rate impact of those errors and the associated corrections, and the actions NYISO has taken to correct the pricing errors. Additionally, NYISO has summarized and discussed the actions it has undertaken during the six month reporting period to reduce or eliminate the types of price errors that occurred. NYISO's filing is accepted for informational purposes.

Public notice of the filing was published in the Federal Register with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before August 21, 2009. No protests or adverse comments were filed.

This acceptance for filing shall not be construed as constituting approval of any rate, charge, classification, or any rule, regulation, or practice affecting such rate or service provided for in the filed documents; nor shall such action be deemed as

recognition of any claimed contractual right or obligation affecting or relating to such service or rate; and such acceptance is without prejudice to any findings or orders which have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against your company.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
