Dear Ms. Salas:

Pursuant to the Commission's February 26, 2002 order in the Docket No. ER02-638-000 ("February 26<sup>th</sup> Order"), the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") hereby respectfully submits its compliance filing. The purpose of this filing is to eliminate tariff provisions pertaining to the NYISO's three proposed pre-scheduling enhancements which the February 26<sup>th</sup> Order rejected without prejudice. Consistent with the February 26<sup>th</sup> Order, the NYISO intends to make a separate tariff filing in the near future to implement the three enhancements.

In addition, this filing incorporates language into Section 4.5a of the NYISO's Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff ("Services Tariff") that was inadvertently excluded from its original December 28, 2001 filing. The NYISO previously alerted the Commission that it would use a compliance filing to re-insert this language, which more clearly specifies the relative scheduling priority to be afforded to certain Pre-Scheduled Transactions.

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The NYISO therefore believes that it is appropriate to include this language in this compliance filing.<sup>2</sup>


