MINUTES OF THE MEETING

1. Introduction, Meeting Objectives & Chairman's Report

Mr. Jerry Ancona of National Grid, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. and noted that the meeting objectives were to approve minutes from the January 25, February 28, and March 29, 2006 meetings, and to discuss the State of the Market Report.

2. Approval of the Minutes

Mr. Ray Stalter (NYISO) highlighted the comments submitted and noted in the respective minutes presented for approval. No additional comments were provided by the Committee.

Motion # 1:

Motion to approve the Minutes of the January 25, 2006, February 28, 2006 and March 29, 2006 Management Committee meetings.

Motion passed unanimously by show of hands.

3. President's Report

Prior to the Report by Mr. Mark Lynch (NYISO), Mr. Ancona, noted the one year anniversary of Mark Lynch as CEO and President of the NYISO.

Mr. Lynch thanked Mr. Ancona and the Committee, and proceeded to ~~the~~ review the Report. Regarding the price corrections, reservations and corrections continue to remain low. Price corrections continue to be monitored and improvements efforts will ~~continue~~persist. The NYISO is investigating a procedure to expedite the release of reserve hours.

Regarding the TCC settlement audit update, Mr. Lynch reported that the audit is complete and the final report is being put together for editorial changes. No substantial issues were noted.

Mr. Lynch reminded the Committee that Sector meetings have been scheduled for June. Each sector has received a request for agenda items. He added a reminder that the Joint MC/Board meeting will be held at the Sagamore Hotel on July 18th.

Mr. Lynch discussed the NYISO's market initiatives and projects. He noted efforts to bolster the quality of the organization by establishing the Lean Six Sigma program and reorganizing the NYISO. Additional consultants were brought in to review internal processes, which resulted in a new function – Enterprise Quality Process Control, under the direction of Wayne Bailey. Mr. Lynch explained that these efforts are intended to raise the bar for standards, quality and efficiency, with the result being reliable products that MP's can count on-on to working from implementation. He added that the NYISO is bringing in PA Consulting to look at the engineering aspect of the business to ensure that processes are accomplishing what is intended. Finally, the NYISO is enhancing the Price Validation system, bringing that process inside the NYISO in order to provide a more robust, transparent pricing system to the NYISO markets. Mr. Lynch wanted to make sure that MPs understand that the goal is to move from a start up business to a more established organization and that, as we focus on these efforts, some project priorities and timelines may change. He added that the completion of these initiatives will result in a higher level of quality for the markets. The NYISO Board has approved this initiative. Mr. Rich Dewey (NYISO) will be working with the PPT on project prioritization.

Mr. Lynch stressed that issues can and will be addressed expeditiously when needed. He gave an example of the scarcity pricing issued noted in the SMD Report from Dr. Patton. The NYISO worked to identify the cause of the concern and developed a software enhancement for addressing physical shortages on the system. -This effort has become the highest priority within the organization. Until the automation is in place, de-rates will be done through a manual process to pick up any physical shortages.

Mr. Morgan Parke (Multiple Intervenors) asked what projects will be delayed and for how long. Mr. Lynch responded that the NYISO will continue to work on mandated FERC projects.

Mr. Mark Younger (Slater Consulting) asked if the NYISO will be reserving prices when we are close to scarcity conditions, and review to ensure that the de-rates were adequate for the conditions. Mr. Rick Gonzales (NYISO) said it is NYISO's intent to do that, and added that the NYISO would review the details of the interim operating procedure with the Market Structures Working Group.

Dr. Kevin Jones (LIPA) asked to see an improved test environment to allow for MP interaction and testing of system changes. He also thanked Mr. Lynch and the NYISO for the NYISO's comments to FERC regarding the ICAP settlement in New England.

Mr. Lynch gave an update on the NYISO move into the new building. He said everything is still on schedule. NYISO staff at the Annex and Wolf Road should be moved to the new headquarters by the beginning of next year. The Phoenix lease expires in May, which will allow construction on the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd floors to begin. The project remains in budget.

Ms. Doreen Saia (Mirant) asked about the status of the price corrections filing with FERC. Mr. Lynch said that NYISO has an obligation to file with FERC by April 30 and

he saw no need for a delay. Mr. Bruce Bleiweis (DC Energy) raised concerns with the time needed to proceed with this filing. Mr. Ira Freilicher (Hunton & Williams for the NYISO) explained that it was drafted and has gone through a review process, which included discussions with the BPCTF.

Mr. Lynch referred the Committee to the Report for market highlights details, and asked that questions be submitted to Ray Stalter.

4. Presentation of 2005 State of the Market Report

Dr. David Patton (Potomac Economics) presented the Annual Report. The Report evaluates the effects of major enhancements made to the market under SMD2 and assesses the overall performance of the NY electricity markets in 2005. Included in the Report presentation was a summary of conclusions and recommendations.

The Report noted the effect of fuel prices on electricity prices. Data in the Report continues to show the relationship of natural gas prices and electricity prices in the market. Gas and oil prices averaged 44% higher in 2005 than in 2004 due to the effects of the hurricane on productive capability. Generators that burn natural gas and oil were on the margin in most hours in New York. (ex. Approximately 70% oil and gas combined). Hot weather also contributed to increased prices - during summer months, implied heat rates in eastern NY were 15 – 20 % higher in 2005 than 2004. Estimated Net Revenues were higher in 2005 than in 2004 due to tighter conditions and fuel price increases.

Mr. Younger asked the following questions:

1. Does the calculation in the report include startup and min gen costs?
2. Given the conditions in 2005, generators should have seen substantially higher revenues. If conditions last year merit new generation, do we have strong enough market signals to incent that investment?
3. Does the analysis include other costs for generators?

Dr. Patton responded by noting that the Report is not meant to assert that generation is profitable, and that the analysis was based on the Real Time market and not the ancillary services market.

Mr. Younger and Mr. Kinney asked how to interpret results of some areas of the report. In response, Dr. Patton noted that he will include information on how the results should be interpreted in the final Report. Mr. Kinney stated that it would be useful to do a multi-year analysis.

Mr. Larry DeWitt (Pace) asked if the Comprehensive Reliability Planning Process could be built into the report. Dr. Patton said that he did review the RNA and put out a memo that he saw no major flaws in that Report.

Turning back to the presentation, Dr. Patton reported on TCC prices and congestion.

Ms. Saia asked if shortfalls were reduced due to corrections related to the TCC settlement, would it be appropriate to consider removing the option to allow TOs to withhold a 5% margin? Dr. Patton responded that he was unsure if the TOs were exercising that option on a regular basis, and would take that into consideration.

Dr. Patton noted the importance of load pocket modeling changes to be implemented by Operations on May 1st as a means of reducing congestion imbalance costs.

Regarding GT dispatch, Mr. Younger asked for more of an explanation of capacity that wasn't scheduled by the physical dispatch, when conditions indicated that more could have been. Dr. Patton responded by noting that there are isolated cases in which there may have been unused resources. The software is being revised to address this better.

Addressing capacity markets, Dr. Patton noted that in-city capacity sales are consistent with the market incentives in place, and that he doesn't expect prices to fall significantly with the addition of new suppliers.

Dr. Patton raised the need to develop ITS further with ISO New England and the potential benefits of more efficient transactions scheduling at the interface between the two Control Areas. Dr. Jones (LIPA) and Mr. Nachmias (Con Ed) raised the development of the 1385 Project, and the potential for a second PJM proxy, respectively, as benefiting transaction scheduling with neighboring control areas. Mr. Howard Fromer (PSEG) noted the discrepancy between transaction scheduling windows and internal generation scheduling timeframes. He asked that consistency between the two be considered. He further noted that the development special market rules for wind projects could further complicate optimization of transactions at the interfaces. Dr. Patton responded by noting that the issue of optimization requires further study and debate.
