

DARU Request Notification

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Background

- ◆ The NYISO currently notifies Market Participants regarding DARU requests via email and web posting at market close (5 A.M.)
 - http://www.nyiso.com/public/market_data/reports/operational_announcements.jsp
- ◆ Market Participants requested more timely notification to ensure that the unit will be available for the DARU request period
 - *DARU requests do not honor Start-up Notification and therefore a unit may be scheduled to run in a time period the unit has indicated is not achievable.*
 - *Advanced notice would allow the unit to either arrange its resources to meet the request OR communicate the unit's inability to meet this request and allow the Transmission Owner to modify its original request to ensure it has the resources it needs to meet its reliability needs.*

Proposed Notification Modification

- ◆ This process deals only with TO-requested DARUs
- ◆ The NYISO proposes:
 - *For ONLY New York City Units - modify the notification process to email and post to the web a DARU request (or deletion) at the time of the request. This would be in addition to the current process at market close (5 A.M.)*
 - New York City units are subject to automated reliability mitigation at the lower of reference or bid.
 - This added notification will be advisory and non-binding
 - *Rest of State units – Advanced DARU notification will be discussed as part of Rest of State Reliability Mitigation discussions started here today*
 - *Update Technical Bulletin TB182*
