New York Independent System Operator, Inc.'s (NYISO) submittal is accepted for informational purposes. On June 1, 2004, you submitted, on behalf of NYISO, the semi-annual demand response program compliance report for the 2003/2004 winter period pursuant to Ordering Paragraph (B) of the Commission's October 24, 2001 order¹, Ordering Paragraph (C) of the Commission's July 19, 2002 order², Paragraph 5 of the Commission's September 3, 2002 Letter Order³, and Paragraph 7 of the October 24, 2003 Order⁴ in this proceeding. NYISO states that since the demand response programs were not activated during the 2003/2004 winter period the programs had no effect on wholesale prices during the period.

Notice of the filing was issued on June 7, 2004, with comments due on June 22, 2004. No protests or adverse comments were filed.
