# NAESB DSM-EE M&V Standards

- ◆ ISO/RTO subgroup presented draft standards at NAESB meeting October 3
- ◆ Two-week informal comment period
- ◆ Comments received from 16 organizations
  - *90 separate comments identified and categorized by NAESB*

- ◆ Revised Draft M&V Standards Recommendation presented at December 2 NAESB meeting in Birmingham, AL

# Dec. 2 NAESB DSM-EE Meeting Results

- ◆ Recommendation approved with 86.5% approval by balanced vote
- ◆ Three amendments to be added to the standards
  - 1. *Title modification to include the word “Framework”*
  - 2. *Language regarding applicability exclusively to ISOs & RTOs*
  - 3. *Clarification on Baseline definition*
- ◆ Formal comment period of 30 days
- ◆ Formal comment review – approx. 2 weeks
- ◆ Examples of applied standards to be developed prior to NAESB Executive Committee meeting
- ◆ Executive Committee vote – February
