NOTICE OF FILING

Take notice that on June 16, 2004, the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO"), filed proposed revisions to the NYISO's Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT") and Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff ("Services Tariff"). The proposed filing would amend the NYISO's creditworthiness requirements to add a component for Wholesale Transmission Service Charges to the Operating Requirement and clarify the Unsecured Credit starting point for certain affiliated municipal electric systems. The NYISO has requested that the Commission make the filing effective on August 16, 2004, 61 days after the above filing date.

The NYISO has served a copy of this filing to all parties that have executed Service Agreements under the NYISO's OATT or Services Tariff.

Any person desiring to be heard or to protest this filing should file a motion to intervene or protest with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 888 First Street, N.E., Washington, D.C. 20426, in accordance with Rules 211 and 224 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (18 CFR §§ 385.211 and 385.214). Protests will be considered by the Commission to determine the appropriate action to be taken, but will not serve to make protestants parties to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a motion to intervene. All such motions or protests should be filed on or before the comment date, and, to the extent applicable, must be served on the applicant and on any other person designated on the official service list. This filing is available for review at the Commission or may be viewed on the Commission's website at www.ferc.gov, using the FERRIS link. Enter the docket number excluding the last three digits in the docket number filed to access the document. For assistance, call (202) 502-8222 or TTY, (202) 208-1659. Protests and interventions may be filed electronically via the Internet in lieu of paper. See, 18 CFR 385.2001(a)(I)(iii) and the instructions on the Commission's website under the "e-filing" link. 
