Changes to Tariff Sections presented at the 9-8-2015 ICAPWG Meeting Drafts

- ◆ At the September 8th ICAPWG meeting, the NYISO presented proposed RMR tariff provisions to MST Section 5, MST Attachment H, and new definitions
- ◆ Today the NYISO is presenting further revisions to the September 8 drafts
- ◆ Changes are marked to revisions presented at the September 8th meeting
- ◆ Revisions to MST Section 5.18, Outage States, will be presented at a future meeting

Proposed Tariff Revisions

- ◆ **New Definitions – MST and OATT**
 - *Noticing Generator*
 - *RMR Avoidable Costs*
 - *RMR Start Date*

- ◆ **MST Section 5**
 - *5.12.4, 5.12.7, 5.12.8: Minor clean up*
 - *5.14.2.1 Minor wording correction*

- ◆ **MST Attachment H**
 - *Section 23.2: no changes since the 9-8-15 meeting; revisions now on the proper tariff base*

Proposed Tariff Revisions (continued)

- ◆ **MST Section 23.4.5.7.12 - If RMR generator is subject to an Offer Floor – language clean up**
- ◆ **MST Section 23.4.5.8 - RMR Agreement Capacity Price and Offer Requirements – language clean up**
- ◆ **What had been presented on September 8th as new Section 23.4.8, is now proposed in a stand alone section. The NYISO plans to incorporate these provisions into OATT Attachment Y with other RMR provisions. Location not yet determined**

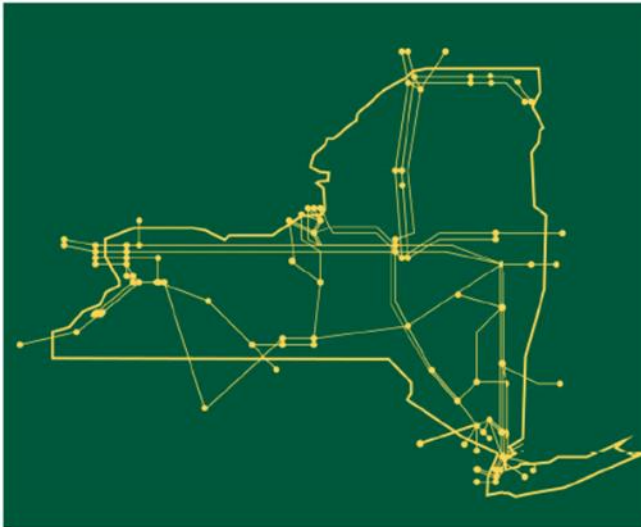
