New York Independent System Operator, Inc.'s (NYISO) submittal satisfactorily complies with the Commission's July 1, 2003 Order¹, and is accepted for informational purposes.

On January 8, 2004, you filed, on behalf of the NYISO, the second quarterly report on the current status of the NYISO's 10 Minute Non-Synchronous Reserve Market (NSR Market). The July 1 Order accepted changes to the NSR Market mitigation measures, and required the NYISO to submit quarterly reports on the competitiveness of the NSR Market. The second quarterly report concludes that the market was workably competitive during the period from July 8, 2003, through December 31, 2003.

This filing was noticed on January 13, 2004, with comments due on January 29, 2004. No protests or adverse comments were filed.
