New York State finalized its Clean Energy Standard (CES), mandating that 50% of all electricity consumed in New York be generated from renewable resources by 2030 while providing incentives to retain the state's existing nuclear capacity. The NYISO supports the state's efforts to reduce the carbon intensity of the generation fleet but recognizes that increased renewable penetration will alter the operational and market dynamics of bulk power system. The NYISO is interested in engaging with stakeholders on mechanisms to facilitate the integration of renewable resources, including market enhancements to accommodate storage technologies as well as market enhancements to establish price signals associated with public policy goals in its wholesale energy prices, thus lessening the need for out-of-market revenues to incentivize clean energy investments. Discussions throughout the day will focus on these areas to help inform stakeholder discussions.
