Regional Topics

- ◆ Regional Planning & Cost Allocation
 - *NYISO is already compliant*
 - *Address in filing letter*
- ◆ Non-Incumbent (ROFR)
 - *No ROFR in NYISO Tariff*
 - *Added entity qualifications and project eligibility requirements*
 - *Provided other clarifications*
- ◆ Public Policy Requirements
 - *Added new Section 31.4 to address planning process*
 - *Added new Section 31.5.5 to address cost allocation*
- ◆ Other Tariff Changes
 - *OATT, Sections 3.8.1 & 3.10 – PSC request for studies*
 - *MST – Attachment O – MMU role for PPR*

Regional Topics

- ◆ Stakeholder Process
 - *10 Joint IPTF/ESPWG meetings held since February 2012*
 - *Draft tariff language provided on June 18th*
 - *Numerous stakeholder comments received*
 - *Draft tariff language revised to address comments and presented at subsequent meetings*

Interregional Topics

- ◆ Stakeholder Process
 - *Four IPSAC webinars held between Nov 2011 and August 2012 to discuss Order 1000*
 - *Proposed revisions to Northeast Protocol presented for discussion in March*
 - *Strawman Proposal for interregional cost allocation presented for discussion in June*
 - *Interregional topics also discussed at IPTF/ESPWG meetings*
 - *Future discussions will be held following October compliance filing on regional topics*
