MINUTES OF THE MEETING

1. Introductions, Meeting Objectives & Chairman's Report

Larry Dewitt of Pace Energy, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:03 AM and welcomed the members of the Management Committee ("MC"). The meeting objectives are to:

- Act on June 21, 2005 minutes
- Act on EDRP Sunset Removal
- Act on DADRP Sunset Removal.

Mr. Dewitt stated that the deadline to submit comments on the market evolution plan has been extended. Market Participants should send their comments to Dave Lawrence at the NYISO. Comments will be reviewed at the August 2nd MSWG meeting. Mr. Dewitt also noted that the annual solicitation for Vice-Chairs, for the Operating Committee ("OC"), Business Issues Committee ("BIC") and the MC would be conducted in July.

2. Approval of the Minutes

Motion to approve was moved by Doreen Saia and seconded by William Palazzo Motion #1:

Motion to approve the Minutes from the June 21, 2005 MC meeting.

(Motion passed unanimously)

3. **President's Report**

Mark Lynch, President and CEO of the NYISO, reviewed the President's Report with the MC. Mr. Lynch reiterated the importance of MP's participation in the UCAP automation testing to ensure a complete testing prior to deployment.

He noted that Elaine Robinson will be assembling a special task force on the pricing and billing process to develop necessary tariff revisions or an action plan that the NYISO may want to put in place. The initial meeting is scheduled for July 20th.

Mr. Lynch stated that the TCC Settlement Audit is in progress. The consultants have already started reviewing the accuracy of the formulas. Ernst & Young will do the final verification of the numbers. Mr. Lynch also urged the TCC holders to contact Ernst & Young in an effort to expedite the verification process.

Mike Mager of Multiple Interveners asked for an update of the sales tax issue. Mr. Mager also requested confirmation on whether the plan is to postpone addressing the GRT issue until after the Sales Tax issues have been resolved.

Rob Fernandez, NYISO General Counsel responded that the language in the last draft that many Market Participants had concerns with is being dropped. The tariff language is being finalized for distribution and review with the registration requirement removed. Mr. Fernandez also noted that the plan is to have a special MC meeting in early August to address the tariff issue with the intent to address the GRT Appeals and the Sales Tax Amendment before the Board at their meeting later in August.

4. Billing Issues

Charles Garber of the NYISO presented the billing issues update to the MC. Mr. Garber noted that the February 2005 4-month true up included:

- The corrections made to the February SMD2 prices
- Sub-zonal load profiling and
- The day ahead margin assurance payments ("DAMAP")

Approximately 59 Million dollars (including interest) were re-allocated from Loads to Generators as a result of the May 8th and 9th, 2000 ELR/ECA, and FERC-ordered settlement. Mr. Garber also noted that, based upon input from MPs and the strong endorsement by BAWG, the entire month of May was invoiced in lieu of May 8th and 9th only.

Neil Butterklee of Con Edison questioned the BAWG's authority to effectively get the NYISO to change its billing process. Mr. Garber responded that there were no changes to the NYISO's billing process; rather, inputs were received from MPs regarding the preferred method of implementing a FERC order, with the vast majority requesting that the May 2000 closeout not be intermingled as a manual adjustment on the July 2005 invoice, primarily for auditing purposes, transparency and the ability to utilize existing reconciliation and verification processes typically applied to regular monthly invoices.

Mr. Butterklee asked how are MPs to replicate the changes in the LECG Refund Report if the necessary analysis and calculations are not contained in the report. Mr. Garber agreed to investigate this question.

Doreen Saia of Mirant requested that the NYISO issue a notice to the Tie List specifying directly that the May 2000 re-bill is not a final bill close-out and specifying who to contact if parties have questions about the settlements associated with the May re-bill, inclusive of settlements associated with May 8th and May 9th. Mr. Garber agreed to do so.

5. Project Status Update

Rich Dewey of the NYISO presented the Project Status Update to the MC. Mr. Dewey stated that there has been an increase in the number of price reservation and price corrections since the SMD2 software was deployed. Many software defects that have led to price corrections have been identified and corrected.

Howard Fromer of PSEG expressed concerns about the software corrections that the NYISO is making and asked if there is documentation available that describes the software changes that NYISO is making and the reason for the changes. Mr. Dewey responded that the NYISO could accommodate Mr. Fromer's request and will make that information available.

Mr. Dewey continued to encourage MPs to provide feedback on the recent web enhancements and to provide suggestions to improve features. He also noted that the June software releases were delayed until July due to system conditions.

6. EDRP Sunset Removal

Aaron Breidenbaugh of the NYISO presented a proposal calling for the removal of the EDRP sunset to the MC. The motion was previously presented at the Business Issues Committee ("BIC") and was approved. Mr. Breidenbaugh noted one additional point not included in his presentation that under the scarcity pricing rules, the EDRP and SCR resources could set price.

Motion #2:

Motion to approve was moved by Mike Mager and seconded by John Dowling The NYISO Management Committee (MC) approves the proposed revision to the NYISO Market Services Tariff, as presented to the MC at the July 13th meeting, and approved in concept by the Business Issues Committee on June 29th, to remove the sunset date for the Emergency Demand Response Program, and requests that the Board authorize a filing to the FERC pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act (Motion passed unanimously with abstentions)

7. DADRP Sunset Removal

Aaron Breidenbaugh of the NYISO presented the removal of the DADRP sunset to the MC. The motion was presented and approved at the Business Issues Committee. Mr. Breidenbaugh noted that there are presently 18 participants in the DADRP program with a participating load of 475 MW, however; only four organizations have participated in the past year and only two since the beginning of 2005.

Motion #3:

Motion to approve was moved by Mike Mager and seconded by John Dowling The NYISO Management Committee (MC) approves the proposed revisions to the

NYISO Market Services Tariff, as presented to the MC at the July 13th meeting, and approved in concept by the Business Issues Committee on June 29th, to remove the

sunset date for the Day-Ahead Demand Response Program, and requests that the Board authorize a filing to the FERC pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act. *(Motion passed unanimously with abstentions)*

8. New Business

Mr. Fromer requested an update on the Board approval and the filing of the tariff provisions to eliminate the start-up and shut down penalties. Rob Fernandez responded that the Board will review the proposal on July 18th and 19th.
