Introduction

- OATT, Attachment Y, section 31.3.2.4.1.1
 describes the process by which Developers may
 qualify to be eligible to propose regulated
 economic projects
 - Phase 2 of the CARIS ("Congestion Assessment and Resource Integration Studies") process
- This tariff language was revised and expanded as part of the Order 1000 tariff revisions
- In preparation for 2016 CARIS 2, conforming changes are being proposed in the Economic Planning Manual



Manual Revisions

- New Section Inserted for "Developer Qualifications"
- Requires Developers to file "Developer Qualification Form"
- Identifies timeline for NYISO responsiveness
 - Within 30 days of receiving all required information from the Developer
- Confirms that Developers qualified under Reliability Planning or Public Policy Transmission Planning processes do not need to resubmit form
 - Developer must provide any material updates when requesting eligibility for Economic Planning Process



Manual Revisions

- Incorporating Provisions of Technical Bulletin #232
- Add Appendix H, incorporating by reference, the "NYISO Qualification Form" in Attachment A of the Reliability Planning Manual
- See redline and clean versions of the Manual included with meeting materials

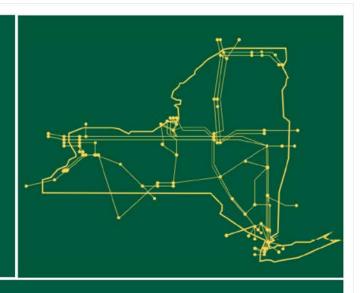


Next Steps
