

FERC Interconnection Order: Preliminary NYISO Staff Position & Schedule for Compliance Filing

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Key Issues for NYISO Compliance Filing

- Framework of the Final Rule is inconsistent with existing NYISO procedures
 - In several significant areas
 - In numerous specific provisions
- FERC indicates it will grant ISOs and RTOs "considerable flexibility to customize the interconnection process" during the compliance phase
- Need to determine whether to adopt certain provisions of the Final Rule or to request retention of existing NYISO practices under the "independent entity variation" standard
 - Review significant structural differences
 - Review specific provisions
- Significant effort to address standard IP and IA requirements

Preliminary NYISO Staff Position

Interconnection Product Definition

Retain current NYISO single interconnection product

"Hard Queue" Requirement

- Retain hard queue for study purposes
- Retain "Class Year" for cost allocation
- Investigate movement towards a 180-day cycle

Cost allocation/pricing policy provisions

• *Retain "Attachment S" procedures*

Specific Interconnection Study Requirements

- Adopt FERC's study sequence
- Modify to accommodate NYISO's practices

Preliminary NYISO Staff Position (Cont'd)

"Pro-forma" Interconnection Procedures

- Modify to incorporate NYISO practices
- Modify to identify NYISO/TO responsibilities

> Three-Party Interconnection Agreement

- Modify to incorporate NYISO practices
- Modify to identify NYISO/TO responsibilities

> Applicability Provisions

- Generation Only
 - Modify to apply to merchant transmission
- "Distribution level" interconnections
 - ► Modify current NYISO criteria to eliminate 115kV voltage threshold

Other Issues: Specific Issues

- Many specific issues that differ or add to existing NYISO interconnection/cost allocation procedures
 - Queuing procedures
 - Study procedures
 - Interconnection agreements
 - Scheduling options for construction
 - Liability issues
- Some issues may be moot if the NYISO proposes to retain its existing interconnection practices
- Others will need to be accommodated in the NYISO compliance filing since the existing NYISO practices do not address them

Proposed Schedule

- > Aug 20 Special TPAS/IITF Meeting
 - » NYISO summarized order/compared with current NYISO procedures
- > Aug 28 MC Meeting
 - » NYISO discussed process

Sept 2 TPAS/IITF Meeting

» Review issues/present preliminary NYISO Staff positions/seek MP input

Sept 9/10 BIC/OC Meetings

- » Review/discuss preliminary NYISO positions
- Sept 17 MC Meeting
 - » Review/discuss preliminary NYISO positions
- Oct 18 Compliance filing due at FERC

Issues & Next Steps

- NYISO, with TPAS concurrence, has determined that an extension of time should be requested
- Significant effort is required; process to continue without delay
- > NYISO's intent is to achieve consensus and stakeholder support for its compliance filing

- NYISO to develop a stakeholder plan/process for preparation of Compliance Filing in conjunction with TPAS
- NYISO to prepare red-lines of pro-forma IP and IA
