SCR Load Zone Peak Hours

- ◆ Provisional ACL tariff changes will become effective starting with Summer 2014 enrollments
 - *New rules for Capability Period SCR Load Zone Peak Hours will be applicable for SCR enrollments starting with Summer 2014*
- ◆ Current rules for SCR Load Zone Peak Hours should be used for submitting the verification data for SCRs that were enrolled with Provisional ACL in Summer 2013 and/or Winter 2013-2014
- ◆ There will be two different sets of SCR Load Zone Peak Hours from the Summer 2013 that are posted to the NYISO website, each serving a different purpose

Two Sets of SCR Load Zone Peak Hours from Summer 2013

1. To be used for submitting the verification data for Summer 2013 Provisional ACL enrollments (“yellow” sheet) based on current tariff rules
 - *Top 40 Hours based on current range of HB13 – HB18 with current exclusion rules for events and tests*
 - *Posted on the NYISO website as “PROVISIONAL ACL VERIFICATION Su-2013 Top 40 SCR Load Zone Peak Hours for Provisional ACL Verification” (“yellow” sheet)*

2. To be used for submitting the ACL data for Summer 2014 enrollments (“white” sheet) based on new rules
 - *Top 40 Hours based on new range of HB11 – HB19 including new exclusion rules for events and tests*
 - *Posted on the NYISO website as “ENROLLMENT - Summer 2013 Top 40 SCR Load Zone Peak Hours for Summer 2014 ACL Enrollment” (“white” sheet)*

Provisional ACL Verification

- ◆ Period for reporting Provisional ACL Verification data for resources enrolled in the Summer 2013 using a Provisional ACL is:
 - *February 5, 2014 – February 19, 2014*
- ◆ Steps RIPs must take to report Provisional ACL Verification data
 - *Export the Provisional ACL Verification file from DRIS containing all SCRs to be reported and the Top 40 Dates and Hours based on current range of HB13 – HB18 with current exclusion rules for events and tests*
 - *Complete import file using SCR metered load values and import into DRIS*

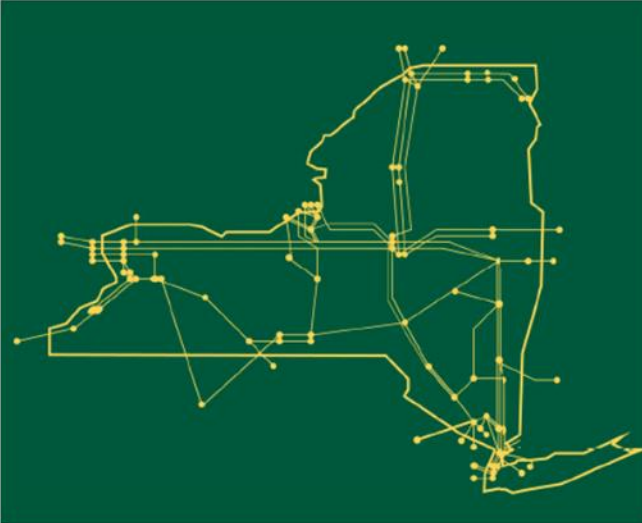
TO Add-backs

- ◆ Transmission Owners will import Demand Reductions for all SCRs enrolled in a TO demand response program that occurred as a result of the SCR reducing demand in Summer 2013 coinciding with any of the SCR Load Zone Peak Hours calculated as follows:
 - *For SCRs enrolled in Summer 2013 using a Provisional ACL, the Top 40 Hours will be based on current range of HB13 – HB18 with current exclusion rule for events and tests*
 - *For all SCR enrollments for the Summer 2014 Capability Period, the Top 40 Hours will be based on new range of HB11 – HB19 including new exclusion rules for events and tests*

Future Process

- ◆ A similar posting of two different sets of SCR Load Zone Peak Hours will occur for the Winter 2013 – 2014 Capability Period
- ◆ Beginning with the submission of verification data from the Summer 2014 Capability Period and enrollments for the Summer 2015 Capability Period, only one set of Capability Period SCR Load Zone Peak Hours will be needed
