Background

- The NYISO requested a clarification to the NPCC Directory #5 - Reserve, regarding the capability of energy storage resources to provide synchronized reserve.
- The NPCC answered that "[...] a storage resource with inverter technology complies with the original intent of the synchronized reserve requirement and therefore shall qualify towards a BA's complement of synchronized reserves".

Background

- Consequently, the NYISO requests approval for including storage resources in the Ancillary Services Manual as providers of Synchronized Reserve.
- Additionally, the NYISO seeks approval for other improvements made throughout the document.

Updates

 Section 6.2.2 - Included clarification regarding Generators or Demand Side Resources, which utilize energy storage devices, as Spinning Reserve providers.

Revisions

• **Global** - Capitalization of first letter for bullet points.

- Utilization of acronyms already defined in the document.
- Section 3.6.1 Corrected the description of metering data flow process, which is not transmitted "from" the NYISO, but "to" the NYISO.
- Section 4.2 Removed requirement for Regulation providers' bidding parameters already included in the same section.

Revisions

- Section 6.1 Removed the description of resources providing Total 30-Minute Reserve, as it had been already included for the corresponding sub-categories.
- Section 6.2.2- Revision of enumeration for criteria items.
 Inclusion of numbers as figures in addition to words.

Next Steps

• Bring changes to the Business Issues Committee for approval in February.
