**MOTION OF NEW YORK INDEPENDENT SYSTEM OPERATOR, INC.
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO SUBMIT BPCG REPORT**

The New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO"), pursuant to Rule 212 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. § 385.212, hereby submits this motion for an extension of time of two weeks for the NYISO to submit the reports specified in the Commission's Order on Compliance Filings ("BPCG Order") in the above dockets, 100 FERC ¶ 61,213 (August 27, 2002).

The BPCG Order directs that:

NYISO should report back to this Commission in 90 days from the date of issuance of this order to state its state-wide BPCG costs during this summer period, the BPCG payments made to Long Island generators, and whether it has allocated costs to Long Island, and if so, when and what costs. NYISO should also provide data and work papers concerning the timing and amount of the BPCG costs incurred to meet Long Island requirements.

The 90 day period expires on Monday, November 25.


In connection with gathering the information requested by the BPCG Order, the NYISO has become concerned that it is likely to be appropriate, after completion of the applicable stakeholder review process, for the NYISO to request Commission approval for certain changes in the standards for the allocation of BPCG costs to Long Island. Those standards, as approved by the BPCG Order, are set forth in Rate Schedule 4 ("Payments for Supplying Operating Reserves"), Section 4.0, of the NYISO's Market Administration and Control Area Services Tariff. The NYISO accordingly requests an extension of two weeks, or until December 9, 2002,

in order to confirm that it has correctly gathered and analyzed all the necessary data that may bear on the appropriate standard for the allocation of BPCG costs to Long Island. This will enable the required report to be consistent with and informative of such subsequent tariff filing as the data show to be appropriate.

WHEREFORE, for the above -stated reasons, the NYISO requests that the Commission extend the due date for the reports specified in the BPCG Order for two weeks, or until December 9, 2002.

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
