Dear Ms. Kavanah:

On June 1, 2009, New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) submitted its semi-annual Reports on Demand Response Programs and New Generation Projects in compliance with previous Commission orders.<sup>1</sup> NYISO states that no activations have occurred since August 3, 2006 in its reliability-based programs, i.e. the Emergency Demand Response Program and the Installed Capacity Special Case Resources. NYISO states that Day-Ahead Demand Response Program registrations have remained constant since January 2009. NYISO also submitted a list of 150 Interconnection Request Transmission Projects for the New York Control Area as of May 27, 2009. The semi-annual Reports are accepted for informational purposes.

Public notice of the filing was published in the Federal Register, 74 Fed. Reg. 27,308, with comments, protests, or interventions due on or before June 22, 2009. No interventions, protests, or adverse comments were filed.
