 - **No issues raised**

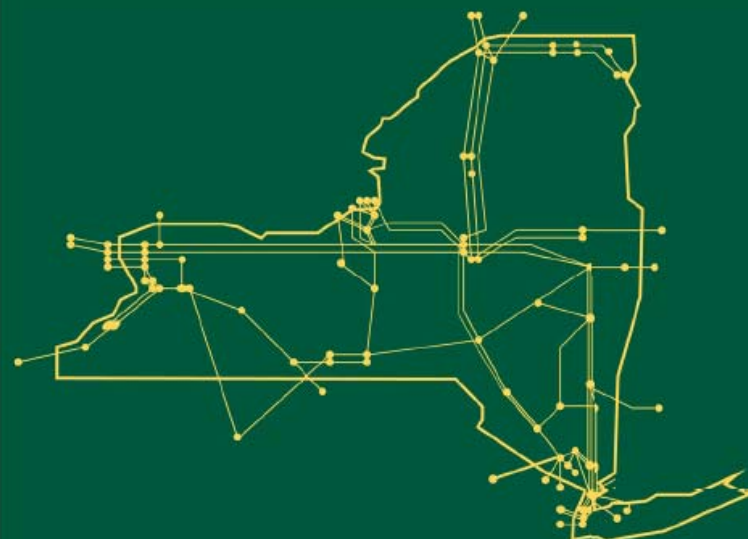
NYS Reliability Council Feedback

 - *RRS did not see the need for any changes to the NYSRC Reliability Rules*
 - *Keep updated regarding DSASP participation and performance*

Next Steps

- ◆ **Work with NYISO stakeholders to develop any necessary rule modifications and associated tariff and manual changes to permit DSASP aggregations**
 - *Limit participation to reserves markets*
 - *Develop procedures to ensure DSASP resources cannot be registered by more than one aggregator*
 - *Define aggregator-to-resource metering capabilities consistent with participation in reserves markets*
 - *Consider if any other specific requirements on participation need to be imposed*
