 - a. NYSEG/RG&E is in the Transmission Owner sector of the NYISO. NYSEG and RG&E, both original members of the New York Power Pool merged in 2001. NYSEG serves 877,000 electricity customers and 261,000 natural gas customers across more than 40% of upstate New York, whereas RG&E serves 368,000 electricity customers and 305,000 natural gas customers in nine counties around the city of Rochester.
 - b. In 2008 they were acquired by Iberdrola Spain and became part of Iberdrola USA.
