RE: Notice of Retirement of Hudson Avenue GT#3 & GT#5; PTID # 23810 & PTID # 23657; Name Plate Ratings: 16.15 MW

Dear Ms. Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison") hereby provides notice to the New York State Public Service Commission ("NYPSC") that it intends to retire Hudson Avenue Gas Turbine #3 ("GT #3") and Hudson Avenue Gas Turbine #5 ("GT #5") by November 1, 2022. The New York Independent System Operator, Inc. ("NYISO") has completed the Generator Deactivation Assessment ("GDA") and found no reliability concerns. The NYISO started the GDA on April 1, 2022 in order to ascertain whether a Generator Deactivation Reliability Need ("GDRN") will result from the retirement of GT #3 and GT #5. A GDRN is a condition identified by the NYISO in a GDA as a violation or potential violation of one or more Reliability Criteria.

GT #3 and GT #5 began operations on July 1, 1970. GT #3 and GT #5 have been operated to provide electric energy and have not been a supply source for the Con Edison steam system. Compliance with the DEC "Peaker" Rule²

would require substantial investment in GT #3 and GT #5, making it uneconomical to continue operations under these new standards.
