Meeting Minutes

1. Introductions and Meeting Objectives & Chairman's Report Report on PPT meeting and discuss June meeting date(s).

Mr. Hiney called the meeting to order at 10:05 AM.

Mr. Hiney has appointed Jim Parmelee as Chairman of the BSP. The position of vice-chair is vacant.

Mr. Hiney asked for the sense of the group regarding two June meetings: 5 and 13 June. The 13 June meeting would incorporate the regular MC items as well as a consideration of the NERTO proposal to be voted on by the respective boards. Most participants supported canceling the June 5th meeting and holding one longer meeting on 13 June, in Albany. Accordingly, the June 5 meeting was cancelled.

Mr. Hiney noted that there are two action items in addition to approval of the minutes.

He reported that the PPT met on 1 May to consider the next group of anchor projects. He asked MC members to provide comments to Ms. Robinson, who would pass them on to PPT members and the appropriate NYISO staff member.

2. Approval of the Minutes.

Motion #1:

Motion to approve the Minutes of April 17, 2002

(Motion passed unanimously by polling members for abstentions and objections)

3. President's Report and Seams Update.

Mr. Museler announced that the IMO started operations on 1 May 2002, and that there are no operational difficulties.

He first discussed item 3 of the handout: project costs and utilization. He focused on the costs and underutilization of pre-scheduling and MHBT. Mr. Scheiderich commented that the lack of dual checkout has made pre-scheduling unattractive. He noted also that the closeness of prices between the NYISO and PJM has lessened the usefulness of MHBT. Mr. Museler said that Customer

Relations would continue to check with MPs to determine any other concerns that might cause the services to be underutilized.

Mr. Museler then discussed the Oversight Committee process under item 4 of the President's Report – RTO issues. In the discussion of the agenda for 3 May Mr. Parmelee said that the process seemed to be moving towards only one-way communications and not true dialogue. Mr. Hiney asked Mr. Museler to convey the desire for two-way dialogue to the Board. Mr. Reed asked that any arrived-at positions be articulated at the beginning of the 3 May meeting. Mr. Museler said that he did not think that anything had been locked down at this point, but that he would pass the request along to the Board.

For the 29 May meeting Mr. Museler agreed that he and Mr. Van Welie would provide a brief summary of the cost/benefit study and the draft filing to be followed by more extensive panel/topic sessions that would be the best use of people's time.

The 30 May meeting is a NY-only meeting and will follow the same format as 3 May.

Mr. Fromer asked whether there would be an explanation of positions in the filing that might be at variance from a stakeholders' consensus. Mr. P. Brown asked that a draft-filing letter be made available if and when one is completed. Mr. Fernandez said that the June filing would be a petition for a joint declaratory order.

Mr. Museler announced that noon 31 May is the cutoff date for any written comments.

He then proceeded to a discussion of seams issues. The previously distributed handout shows the status of the items. A strictly NY item that affects seams is BME/SCD convergence, and it is scheduled for deployment on 28 May.

There are still some issues to be resolved regarding the ICAP deliverability project. He hopes that the staffs can resolve the remaining elements of that issue. Mr. Picardi felt NY should revise its liberal deliverability practices for external ICAP to NY if PJM refused to accept NY supply as PJM ICAP.

Ms. Saia noted that PJM's proposal would leave MPs financially exposed, and would be unlikely to lead to exports of ICAP.

4. Motion to Establish an Effective Date for Already-Approved RS-1 Tariff Amendment to Recover Certain Costs @15% from Generators and 85% from Loads.

Mr. Parmelee presented the motion. He reminded the MC that it had last considered the item in December. There was no date in the original presentation. NYISO Staff reported tariff language would be shared with the Tariff Review Committee today. There is recognition that the billing software may not be able to handle the allocation yet, but the group wanted to put forth an effective date so as to start the accrual process as intended. He moved, and Mr. Duthie seconded the motion.

Mr. Ragogna noted that RS-1 may have to float on a daily basis, something that will be considered by the BIC.

Mr. Reed wondered why the MC was voting on a date if they had concerns about the allocation itself. Almost any concern would logically generate a “no” vote.

Mr. Picardi asked how an MP would keep track of the charges if the billing software were not ready. NYISO staff reported that they could make information on the costs to be recovered in this fashion available for Market Participants prior to actual implementation. Mr. Ragogna noted Messrs. Picardi’s and Younger’s request for as transparent as possible a flow of information on the charges.

Motion #2:

WHEREAS the Management Committee has approved recovery in Rate Schedule 1 (in both the OATT and the Services Tariff) of the fixed ISO Budget and FERC regulatory fees, excluding those costs designated in Rate Schedule 1 Section 4, from all market participants based on Energy Transactions (i.e. injections and withdrawals) such that injections, excluding wheelthroughs, and sales to the NYISO market assume 15% of the charges and loads, wheelthroughs and withdrawals from the market assume 85% of the charges; and

WHEREAS no effective date for such change was specifically included in the Management Committee’s action on that issue; therefore

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Management Committee requests that the NYISO staff include in its Section 205 filing an effective date of June 1, 2002 for this change and ask FERC to approve such effective date.

(Motion passed with 59.15% affirmative votes)

5. Motion to Revise Creditworthiness Requirements for TCC Auction Participants. This motion was approved at the BIC on 26 April 2002. Slides 11 and 12 will be discussed.

Mr. Gootee reviewed slides 11 and 12 of the previously distributed package for the MC. The BIC received and considered a completed review of the policy. (See handout.) There are separate recommendations for positive and negative TCCs. Ms. Saia considers the policy to be a positive first step, but wants to see further improvements, as it requires too much collateral to be posted.

Motion #3:

The Management Committee hereby requests that the Board concur in a Section 205 filing to amend the NYISO tariffs to implement a revised Transmission Congestion Contract collateral requirement as reflected in the material distributed to the Management Committee on Thursday April 25, 2002.

(Motion passed unanimously with abstentions by polling members for abstentions and objections)

6. Report on Revised Credit Policy Motion as discussed and Approved at the BIC.

Mr. Wemple recapped the BIC discussion, which directed that the Credit Policy Working Group be reconvened and that specific recommendations be brought to BIC and then the MC. The resolution, which had been approved by BIC and presented at today's MC meeting, conveys some of the changes that BIC wants instituted into the policy.
