Draft MINUTES OF THE MEETING

1. Introductions, Meeting Objectives & Chairman's Report

Joe Oates of Consolidated Edison, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:04 AM and welcomed the members of the Management Committee ("MC"). The meeting objectives are to approve minutes from the September 1 MC meeting, to vote on candidates to fill the position of MC Vice Chair, and to act on the Initial Planning Report. Mr. Oates commented that the Project Prioritization Team met via phone to review the proposed 2005 projects. The list has been posted to the NYISO website for MP review.

2. Approval of the Minutes

Motion #1:

Motion to approve the Minutes from the September 1 MC meeting.

(Motion passed unanimously by show of hands)

3. Presentation of Candidates for Position of MC vice Chair

Mario DiValentino of Strategic Power Management and Jerry Ancona from National Grid are the candidates. Mr. Oates commented that email ballots for MC members present on the phones are to be sent to Leigh Bullock or Ray Stalter at lbullock@nyiso.com or rstalter@nyiso.com or rstalter@nyiso.com or

Two votes were conducted by secret ballot; neither vote was successful. A 58% approval vote is required to elect one of the candidates. As a result, the election of a Management Committee Vice Chair was deferred to the November meeting, where it will be acted on again with the same slate of candidates.

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4. President's Report

William Museler of the NYISO stated that any comments on the FERC NOI should be sent to Brad Kranz at <u>bkranz@nyiso.com</u> for incorporation into the IRC response.

Mollie Lampi of the NYISO commented on the creation of the seven-member Environmental Advisory Council. November 18th is the first scheduled meeting. The names of the council members will be emailed to all committee members. Paul Gioia commented that the council was set up without clear definition, and without MP consultation. Mr. Museler stated that the NYISO will post information on the council, along with information on council members by today. Comments can be emailed to Mollie Lampi at <u>mlampi@nyiso.com</u>.

Market Performance Highlights for September 2004

Mr. Museler noted that Price Reservations and Corrections are down for the fifth month in a row. Day Ahead Regulation prices are up 59% relative to last month (from \$17.88/MWh to \$28.50/MWh) but are only up 5% relative to the same month last year.

Pancaking and Intra-hour Transaction Scheduling ("VRD") Developments with New England

<u>Elimination of Rate</u> Pancaking <u>on the New England border</u> was approved by the MC and NYISO Board, and the NYISO has made a §205 filing to FERC on June 21, 2004. NEPOOL filed on September 30, 2004 to eliminate export charges on exports and wheel-throughs from New England to New York effective December 1, 2004.

The Intra-hour Transaction Scheduling ("VRD") pilot was approved by the MC and the NYISO Board and a there was a §205 filing to FERC on September 30. Testing will be conducted during the winter 2004-2005 period, depending on ISO-NE participation. Joint Stakeholder meetings on alternative approaches to VRD are to begin in October.

5. NYISO Facilities Update

Mr. Museler presented background information and the rationale for proceeding with this proposal. The recommendation to the Board to purchase an existing office building, and build an ACC inside it, could potentially be presented to the Board in November. The current schedule would be to purchase the building in the 1st quarter of 2005, then transition to the new building in phases, starting in the 3rd quarter of 2005 and concluding in the 2nd quarter of 2007. Comments on this issue can be sent in to the NYISO via Brad Kranz.

Mario DiValentino of Strategic Power Management stated that he is very concerned that the NYISO will exceed the proposed future budgets in acquiring and modifying the new facility.

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Mr. Gioia stated that <u>market participants havee has not been provided with the kind of a</u> cost benefit analysis that would allow them to make a judgment with respect to the <u>options presented by the NYISO staff for the regarding new NYISO facilities. Mr. Museler</u> stated that the NYISO would provide the requested analysis at an upcoming BS&P <u>Subcommittee meeting.</u>, and the breakdown of the \$23 million cost for the <u>recommended path.</u> Mr. Gioia requested that the analysis be circulated to the market participants as soon as possible and that it include support for estimated cost for the various options, including the \$23 Million cost estimate to the base case option, Mr. Museler agreed to provide the analysis as soon as possible.feels that a review of the CBA is warranted. Mr. Museler stated the NYISO will provide the requested information.

Jim Scheiderich said in this proposal the PCC will remain a risk, as there is no appropriate perimeter. Mr. Museler stated that the existing PCC with some security modifications should be more than adequate and added that the proposed ACC will have excellent security characteristics. Brad Kranz of the NYISO commented that further discussion can be carried out at the next BS&P meeting.

6. SMD Readiness Report

Garry Brown of the NYISO reported that deployment is scheduled for December 1, 2004. A detailed readiness plan has been developed. Mr. Brown reported on testing objectives, and the NYISO's next steps. Brad Kranz noted that manuals impacted by SMD2 are being revised and will be available under the manual revision section of the website. Mike Darroch of Jamestown BPU asked if a full list of "Day 2" items can be made available, and Mr. Brown clarified that they will be. The elimination of rate pancaking with New England can be deployed with SMD as they both have December 1 implementation dates. Mr. Scheiderich asked how the elimination of rate pancaking would be accomplished. The NYISO will get back to Mr. Scheiderich with the answer. Mr. Brown stated that the NYISO will come back to the MC at the November 10th meeting to discuss the then current state of readiness to deploy SMD2.

7. Billing Issues Update

Jim Scheiderich of Select Energy provided a status update to the MC members, and commented on what is being done to resolve the current problems. A group called the Billing Issues Resolution Team ("BIRT") has been formed to gather information, scope effort, and provide recommendations. Mr. Scheiderich presented a settlement timeline that addresses final bills.

Howard Fromer of PSEG asked if litigation issues will be lumped in with this process. Mr. Scheiderich stated that litigation issues are outside of this process.

8. Update on Seams and Market Improvement Projects

Belinda Thornton of the NYISO presented the update. Last Friday the inter-ISO teleconference took place regarding seams issues.

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Recent Initiatives

- **Regional Resource Adequacy ("RAM")** The NYISO is nearing completion of the adjustments on the demand curves, and the plan is to turn attention back to the ICAP working group to discuss further seams related proposals.
- Virtual Regional Dispatch Mr. Scheiderich commented that the VRD project on the FERC reports has been renamed to Intra-Hour Transaction Scheduling.
- **E-Tagging** Phase II of the project is anticipated for the 2nd quarter of 2005

Issues Pending Further Discussion

- External Reserve Supply from NY to ISO-NE
- NY MS-7040 Transfer Study
- Congestion Rent Shortfalls Resulting From External Transmission Outages

The NYISO will determine the appropriate working groups to start discussions on the above issues. The NYISO asked for comments on the Seams Report being issued quarterly versus the current monthly updates at both MC and BIC. The consensus was to move to quarterly reports, but to include the Seams Report in the handouts.

9. Presentation on the Proposed 2005 Budget

Mario DiValentino of Strategic Power Management, Inc. presented this issue. Mr. DiValentino provided the BSP's 2005 draft budget recommendation and highlighted the budget objectives. Mr. DiValentino presented the current budget schedule and displayed a summary of projects included and those that had not been assigned resources in 2005.

10. Report on Proposed 2005 Priority Projects

Tim Schmehl of the NYISO reported on the current criteria used in evaluation of projects and the constraints on resources. A numeric scoring system is now used to evaluate criteria.

<u>Mr. Joe Oates mentioned that the PPT list was available and that they are seeking</u> market participants' input. Mr. Oates asked that the NYISO send out a notice to the MP's telling them that they could contact one of the Chairs/Vice Chairs to provide comment.

11. Approval of Initial Planning Report

Bill Pallazo of NYPA presented background information, the initial planning process steps and objectives. He provided a summary of the report on Resource Adequacy, Transmission Assessment, and Historic Congestion.

Motion #2:

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The Management Committee approves the final draft dated September 16, 2004 of the "NYISO Initial Planning Report" as modified at the September 23, 2004 Operating Committee meeting.

(Motion passed unanimously by show of hands with abstention

12. New Business

Tim Bush, from of Navigant Consulting, representing the New York Municipal Utility Association of New York asked for an update on the TCC historical analysis. Mr. Museler stated the NYISO and LECG are close to a conclusion on the analysis. The NYISO will confirm the results in the near future, and will determine the method of communicating the information to the marketplace.
