Background & presentation objective

- The work plan anticipates Draft Recommendations by August 1, 2018.
 - The draft recommendations will be based on the NYISO's <u>straw proposal</u>.
 - The draft recommendations will reflect the work performed by the IPPTF including feedback received from stakeholders (written and verbal).
 - The draft recommendations will also indicate where additional meetings are anticipated and/or more work is anticipated by the IPPTF.
- The recommendations will be finalized by the end of October 2018 and the proposal will be issued by the end of December 2018.
- Today's meeting provides a summary of the changes that the NYISO intends to reflect in the draft recommendations and provides an opportunity for additional feedback from stakeholders.



Proposal Sections

- Concept for Carbon Pricing
 - No changes to this section are anticipated at this time.
- Setting the Gross Social Cost of Carbon
 - Incorporate the information provided in the April 23, 2018 DPS staff presentation.
- Application of the Carbon Price to Internal Suppliers
 - Add more details to the emissions reporting proposal.
 - Add proposed alternative that the NYISO estimate emissions and that the emitting resources only report EPA-accepted data.
 - Add information on the proposal to approximate the carbon component of LBMP for transparency.
- Application of the Carbon Price to External Transactions
 - Reflect July 9 presentation on benefits and drawbacks of the two options considered.



Proposal Sections (continued)

- Allocation of the Carbon Charge Residuals to Loads
 - Report on the comments received from stakeholders
 - Issue Track 5 work will report the allocations of all three approaches
- Changes to Other NYISO Markets and Planning Processes.
 - No substantive changes expected to this section.
