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#### What is evaluation

- A brief overview of the purpose and types of evaluation

- Evaluation is an integral part of the Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard (EEPS) and System Benefits Charge (SBC) programs
  - As part of the EEPS Proceeding, a working group was established to deal with evaluation and reporting issues and make recommendations to the Commission
  - Commission adopted a strong evaluation program to apply equally to utilities and NYSERDA (June 2008, Order, 07-M-0548)

#### Key Commission Actions include

- Increased evaluation budgets from 2% to 5% of the overall program budgets
- Mandated an increased Staff role in guiding and overseeing evaluation and reporting activities
- Required detailed evaluation and reporting guidelines
- Required monthly, quarterly, and annual reporting
- Established a statewide Evaluation Advisory Group (EAG) to advise the Commission and Staff on evaluation and reporting issues

#### • Evaluation Advisory Group (EAG)

- Represents about 20 organizations and a membership with extensive energy program and evaluation experience
- A proven mechanism to enhance communication, resolve critical evaluation issues and develop cooperation with an array of organizations including those not regulated by the Commission (e.g., LIPA, NYPA, NYISO)
- Evaluation consultant (TecMarket Works) offers the EAG critical support services

- Some key achievements/on-going activities of Staff/EAG
  - Establish evaluation guidelines/standards
  - Review all evaluation plans and provide oversight of related evaluation components (e.g., surveys, draft reports). This effort has often increased quality and sometimes lowered evaluation costs
  - Enable statewide evaluation studies financed collectively by the program administrators
  - Play a major role in the Northeast Energy Efficiency Partnership's EM&V Regional Forum

#### Some key achievements/on-going activities of Staff/EAG

- The EAG and Staff lead the process to update "technical manuals"
- The technical manuals are designed to provide a uniform, measure specific approach for estimating energy savings associated with the EEPS/SBC program portfolio
- Five manuals, covering different sectors, were approved by the Commission

#### Reason why the Technical Manual is important

- Removes undocumented or unsupported assumptions from calculations to increase the reliability of projected impacts
- Utilizes vetted evaluation data
- Avoids conflicting energy savings estimates for the same measure within different programs
- Reduces uncertainty over lost revenue and incentive calculations

### Reporting: another important EAG/Staff role

- Create a comprehensive program reporting and tracking system featuring monthly, quarterly and annual reports
- Reports show EEPS program progress on several key metrics (e.g., energy savings, expenditures, program specific data, statewide results)
