Project Progress - Tariff Revisions

- Tariff changes to implement BoP TCC
 Auction and enhancements to TCC Credit
 Policy
 - BIC and MC approved in December 2016
 - NYISO Board of Directors approved on February 14, 2017
- Next Steps
 - Filing with FERC planned for mid-March

Project Progress - Execution

- Development
 - Complete on December 29, 2016
- Testing
 - In progress
 - Expected to complete on June 3, 2017

Project Progress - Execution

- Production Deployment
 - Planned for June 13, 2017*
 - TCC AMS changes effective on deployment
 - Certain credit rules change on deployment
 - Monthly formula will change immediately
 - BoP credit rules apply beginning with the first BoP TCC auction
- First BoP TCC Auction (decoupled mode)
 - Expected to be conducted in August 2017 (September Reconfiguration Auction)
 - Given the planned timing of software deployment in June 2017, the BoP TCC Auction functionality will not be available for use in connection with the July Reconfiguration Auction

*Contingent upon timely approval from FERC and completion of all project testing

Planned Work - Communication

- Design Changes WebEx
 - Single session planned for the week of March 27th
 - To highlight Graphical User Interface (GUI), auction outputs, and reporting changes effective on deployment

Planned Work - Training

- Market Trials
 - Planned for week of June 5th
- WebEx Training Sessions
 - Multiple sessions planned for the weeks of May 29th and June 12th
 - Detailed review of system changes
- User's Guide Updates
 - To be posted the day after software deployment
