		 IPSAC webex will be held in May, 2016 to review the final NCSP report

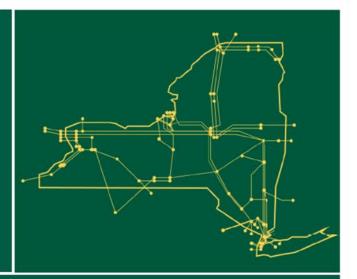
