

# BIC: Chair's Report

- Bidding over DMNC
  - OC adopted a different but acceptable approach (Tech Bulletin to come)
- NYISO Operating Committee April 19, 2000 Approved Motion, with friendly amendment approved by show of hands, and reformatted prior to distribution
- The Operating Committee finds and declares that there is no adverse impact on reliability to allow generation to operate above DMNC and allow generation to bid that energy into the DAM and BME markets provided that the bid is limited to the “Proven Maximum Production Capability.”
  - Proven Maximum Production Capability is defined as the maximum production during the appropriate contiguous period ( per section 4.2.2 of the NYISO ICAP Manual) during the current Capability Period or either of the prior two Capability Periods. For hydroelectric units, the Proven Maximum Production Capability may also be based on other production data provided by the owner and deemed acceptable by the ISO.
  - We further recommend that this be implemented by the Summer Capability Period.

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- Still an opportunity to comment on Interconnection Agreements to Greg Campoli
- ICAP ISSUE:  
Need to assent to changes for the ICAP Compliance Filing based on information sent by Ted Murphy
- Reserve WG:  
JReese, VBudd and JScheiderich collaborating on the notes and issues from the 4/14 meeting.
- Nodal Pricing WG  
Does the BIC see any advantage in pursuing this at this time given the cost and effort involved?

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- Idea afloat at ISO to allow half hour schedule changes  
PLS NOTE THAT THIS IS TENTATIVE!
  - Involves normal bidding with timestamp setting whether bid goes on hour or half-hour
  - Needs far less software effort than more formal change
  - Is being run by Operations
- Based on discussion of Interruptible Loads and SCRs at the OC, Operations needs to develop procedures to handle SCRs (JES to follow up)

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- BIC: Do we want a presentation by Ktammam on LEER and MRD?
- HQ offered to provide 30 M NSR via the HVDC to NY on a bid in basis
  - operations staff will investigate doing this
  - believe it is allowed for in the Tariff
