DSS Business Objects Upgrade

- The NYISO is upgrading the DSS Platform from SAP Business Objects XI R3.1 to SAP Business Objects XI R4.1
 - *Upgrade targeted for the middle of December.*
- The upgrade is necessary to maintain alignment with the vendor platform and support plans
 - *Mainstream SAP support for current version ends in 2015.*
 - *Current version has limited compatibility with newer browsers.*

DSS Business Objects Upgrade

- The upgrade will provide a new look and feel
 - *More intuitive user interfaces.*
 - *Improved user administration features.*
 - *HTML based pages to display Webi reports (no client-side JAVA will be required).*

- Existing corporate report structures and processes (such as the ADD and CADD) and Send/To features will not change functionally.

- Links on the pages will not change.

DSS Business Objects Upgrade

- The inbox contents and personal folders will be migrated as part of this upgrade.
 - *Users are requested to review their personal folders and identify/remove any obsolete reports or contents.*
- Mechanics of scheduling CADD
 - *Scheduling destination changed from CADD to inbox.*
- Retirement of Desktop Intelligence
 - *Deski is no longer supported in new platform.*
 - *Any Deski reports must be converted to Webi by deployment as they will not run or be editable following the upgrade.*


