

Third Party Supply Definition

- 3rd Party Supply – Amount of Load exceeding Generation Net of Self Supply & Remote Self Supply within a Calendar Month.
- By definition requires all data for the month to be available before SS, RSS and 3rd Party supply calculations can begin.
- SS and RSS Station Power Load is exempt from Ancillary Service Charges.
- Expectation is that total Monthly 3rd Party Supply MWhr will be Minimal.

Third Party Supply Issue Statement

- Settlement Responsibility for 3rd Party supply is shifted from the Supplier to the LSE.
- 3rd Party Supply is Subject to Ancillary Service Charges.
- Specific Hours and Amounts of 3rd Party Supply are not Known until Month End.
- Some Ancillary Services are Based on Load Ratio Share Calculations.
- Result – To Accurately Account for All Ancillary Services **ALL** Daily Settlements would have to be Re-Run.

Third Party Supply Recommendation

- NYISO Staff Opinion is that to re-run all settlements, affecting all LSE bills by infinitesimal amounts is not cost effective.
- **Option 1** – Eliminate Ancillary Service charges on 3rd Party Supply.
- **Option 2** – Charge Ancillary Services using a Hourly / Daily Average MWhr Cost, totalized and Reported as a Monthly Charge.
 - Excess AS Collections would be rolled back into Schedule 1 as a Monthly Credit to all Loads.

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
