Overview

- Elimination of export charges on transactions from NYCA to New England
 - Eliminate TSC and NTAC on Exports and Wheels-Through
- > Joint Filing: NYISO & NYTOs
 - Filing affects TOs' transmission revenue requirements
- Limited, at this time, to exports to New England
 - Consistent with FERC's RTO-NE Order
 - Consistent with Pat Wood letter to NYISO (January 2004)
- ➤ Filing letter expresses New York's willingness to eliminate export charges to other regions that will agree to reciprocal arrangements

Status in New England

- ➤ Agreement in principle achieved on April 22nd between NYISO, ISO-NE, NY and NE state regulators to an elimination of export fees between the regions
- > ISO-NE is working with NECPUC and NETOs
- > NECPUC has held several meetings with NETOs
 - Need to resolve retail rate recovery issue
 - Need to resolve NUSCO reciprocity "concerns"
- > NYISO coordinating with ISO-NE on RTO-NE Compliance Filing
- Proposed filing letter drafted assuming that NE issues will not be resolved when NY files
 - Language can be modified if an agreement is achieved

NYISO Proposed Tariff Filing

- Effective date will be the same date that NE eliminates export fees to NY on a "reciprocal and unconditional basis"
 - Expected to be on or before December 22, 2004
 - Request waiver of FERC's 120-day filing requirement
- > Conditioned Upon:
 - Unconditional reciprocal elimination on charges from NE to NY
 - No change in NYISO OATT tax-exempt provisions
 - NYTOs ability to recover their revenues
- > Reservation of Rights if Conditions are not met:
 - NYISO and TOs have right, jointly or separately, to make a 205 filing to reinstate the export charges to New England

Proposed Tariff Filing (Cont'd)

- > Applicable sections of NYISO OATT:
 - Section 7.B.1: TSC
 - Section 7.B.4: NTAC
 - Attachment H: Section I.1.0 TSC; I.7.0 NYPA TSC; II.1.0 NTAC
- ➤ Consistent with NYISO/NYTO Principles issued in June 2003, the tariff will NOT contain:
 - Phase-out period
 - Transition charge
 - Benefit sharing
- Other export charges will continue to apply
 - e.g. Scheduling, Operating Reserves, Reactive Supply

Billing & Accounting Implications

> TSC elimination on NE border

- NYISO still needs to track transactions to New England for billing ancillary services
- NYISO reports transaction data to TOs
- TOs will not bill TSC for exports to New England
- No NYISO BAS modifications needed

> NTAC

- NYISO tracks transactions to New England
- NYISO will zero out NTAC charge for transactions to New England but retain NTAC for other exports
- BAS Code modifications will be required
 - ▶ Initial implementation (December 2004 or sooner) likely to be manual
 - ▶ End-state project under development: target date August 2005

- May 29th Proposed Tariff Language posted
- > June 2nd MC Informational conference call
- > June 4th MC approval
- ➤ June 15th Board approval
- Coordinate with ISO-NE Compliance Filing
 - Due June 22nd
- > File by end of June
