




NYISO'S Annual Charge NYISO Projection

Proposed FERC Fee Recovery Amount

- FERC's Budget has increased an average of 4% annually for Fiscal Years 2010-2020
- NYISO has experienced an average increase of approximately 4% annually during this same timeframe
- Proposed amount for Fiscal Year 2021 FERC fee recovery is \$14.2M
- \$14.2M represents an increase of approximately 4% from Fiscal Year 2020 actual fee assessed
