

STATEMENT REGARDING TRIGEN CC ICAP INELIGIBLE FORCED OUTAGE  
GENERATOR DEACTIVATION ASSESSMENT

Section 38.3.2 of the NYISO OATT states that, for Generators that enter an ICAP Ineligible Forced Outage, the NYISO “shall determine whether it will (a) immediately commence a Generator Deactivation Assessment to review the deactivation of the Initiating Generator, or (b) if practicable, add the Initiating Generator to a STAR that is already in progress, or (c) to include the Initiating Generator in the next STAR it commences.”

The NYISO, in consultation with LIPA, has determined that it should include the Trigen CC ICAP Ineligible Forced Outage in the 2022 Quarter 2 Short-Term Assessment of Reliability (STAR), which commenced on April 15, 2022. The 2022 Quarter 2 STAR also includes the retirement of this unit proposed for March 31, 2022.<sup>1</sup> The 2022 Q2 STAR Start Date was April 15, 2022.

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<sup>1</sup> The submitting entity has proposed to deactivate the generator on March 31, 2022, which is less than 91 days after the STAR Start Date. The earliest possible retirement date for the generator is July 15, 2022. See OATT Section 38.3.7 for additional requirements.
