

BSM Exemption Posting Documents – Format Update

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Background

- This presentation outlines a posting change to add transparency to the current Buyer-Side Mitigation (BSM) process and has no impact on determinations. The ISO is committed to work through ongoing reforms of CMR.
- The Market Administration and Control Area Service Tariff (MST) provides an opportunity for Competitive Entry Exemption (CEE) and Renewable Entry Exemption (REE) for Examined Facilities under Sections 23.4.5.7.9 and 23.4.5.7.13 respectively.
- MST also requires that the NYISO posts on its website a list of Examined Facilities that have requested an exemption, if they met the criteria for such requests and whether the exemption was granted or denied (once final determinations were made)
 - (MST Sections 23.4.5.7.9.4.1 and 23.4.5.7.13.4.4)

Background

- **The NYISO has historically posted these documents each study period.**

Example:

- i. At the start of a Class Year (CY) or Additional System Deliverability Upgrade (SDU) study, the NYISO would post a list of examined facilities and their exemption requests.
 - ii. Once the NYISO completed its Buyer-Side Mitigation (BSM) analysis and made a determination, the NYISO would post the results of the exemption request.
- **This method of posting exemption requests made it difficult for stakeholders to identify examined facilities that have requested exemptions in the past.**
 - It required sifting through different Class Years to find the historical list of exemption requests.

Update to CEE/REE Postings Format

- The NYISO has made the following update to the list of Examined Facilities requesting exemptions
 - Instead of a separate list each class year, the NYISO has created a running list of exemption requests that spans several class years.
 - Provides a central repository for identifying requests across different Class Years


