# Background



## **Background**

- NYISO presented an initial round of modified tariff to stakeholders on 5/24
  - Modifications included:
    - A new definition of CESIL to be incorporated into MST Section 2.3
    - An update to the definition of Demand Response as it appears in MST Section 2.4
- NYISO has reworked the proposed CESIL definition to reflect stakeholder feedback



# **Proposed Tariff Modification**



## **Updated Definition of CESIL**

#### MST Section 2.3:

Critical Electric System Infrastructure Load: Load that is critical to maintaining the reliable operation of electric system infrastructure, including, without limitation, Load that is (i) necessary to maintain the delivery of natural gas, fuel oil, and other fuels used by Generators (including Local Generators) to generate electricity, (ii) likely to impact the supply of natural gas, fuel oil, and other fuel to Generators, or (iii) otherwise likely to impact Generator operation. Critical Electric System Infrastructure Load does not include on-site Load that is consumed for ancillary purposes unless such Load is necessary for compliance with parts (i) – (iii) of this definition.



# Manual Updates for CESIL



## Manual Updates for CESIL

- Manual updates will include examples of CESIL and non CESIL, ancillary Loads. The NYISO anticipates collaborating with stakeholders in the coming months to update the following manuals for CESIL:
  - Aggregation Manual (in development for DER)
  - EDRP Manual
- NYISO will not require DSR enrollment materials to be updated to include a CESIL compliance attestation.

- Targeting July 2022 to file the applicable Tariff language with FERC.
