35.5.9 New York - PJM IROL Interface(s)

The Parties share a joint IROL related transfers related to the interconnecting transmission lines between their respective Reliability Coordinator Areas and Balancing Authority Areas. This IROL is adhered to will adhere to IROLs that each Party develops in accordance with its respective procedures.¹ in orderIROLs will be determined as needed to maintain acceptable steady-state and transient performance of the NYISO and PJM Transmission Systems. Each Party will specify in its procedures the list of interfaces to which IROLs apply.² Both Each Partyies will monitor this limit<u>these limits for their respective IROLs</u> in accordance with this Agreement and independently determine the applicable import and export transfer limits. BothEach Partyies agrees to operate the <u>NYISO – PJM</u> interface to the most conservative limits developed in realtime and the day-ahead planning process. These operating limits shall be determined in accordance with Standards Authority Standards. Both Parties will take coordinated corrective actions, when requested by either Party, to avoid an exceedance violation of theany IROL identified. If an exceedance violation occurs, actions will be taken to clear the violation exceedance as soon as possible, and in accordance with Standards Authority Standards.
