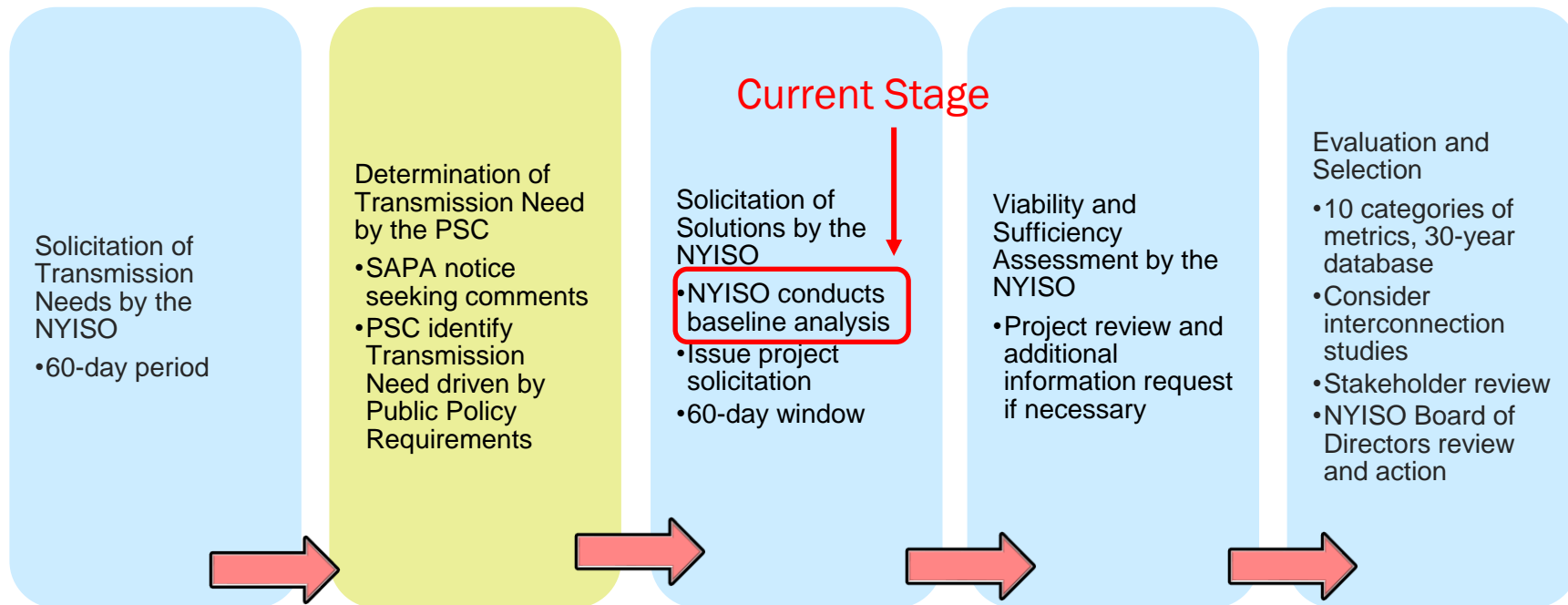

# Preliminary VSA Baseline Case Update

- Preliminary powerflow and auxiliary files are now available for interested developers & consultants
- Baseline case assumptions are outlined in the August 22<sup>nd</sup> ESPWG presentation
- As part of the proposal, Developers need to propose where and how the 4,770 MW of incremental offshore wind is connected to the existing system. More specifically, the proposal needs to include:
  - Modeling of OSW injections and locations
  - Modeling of proposed transmission solutions
  - Demonstration of generation deliverability through documentation such as a developer planning study

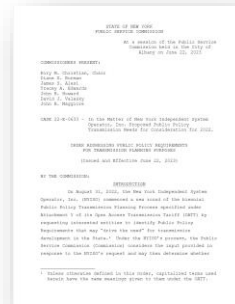

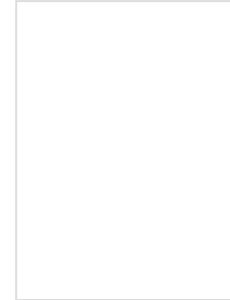
